AN ORDINANCE ADDING ARTICLE IV - NOISE DISTURBANCES TO CHAPTER 10 OF THE VILLAGE CODE OF MT. AUBURN

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF MT. AUBURN, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. A new ARTICLE IV - NOISE DISTURBANCES is hereby added to Chapter 10 of the Village Code of Mt. Auburn which shall read as follows:

<u>CHAPTER 10</u> <u>ARTICLE IV - NOISE DISTURBANCES</u>

Sections:

4-4-1 Definitions.

4-4-2 Prohibited activities.

4-4-3 Exceptions.

4-4-4 Violation--Penalty.

4-4-1 Definitions. As used in this chapter:

- A. "Noise Disturbance" means any sound of shouting, yelling or singing which unreasonably annoys or disturbs a reasonable person of normal sensitivities.
- B. "Person" means any individual, association, partnership, entity, trustee or corporation.
- C. "Real property boundary" means the property line along the ground surface, and its vertical extension, which separates the real property owned by one person from that owned by another person.
- 4-4-2 Prohibited activities. It is unlawful to shout, or yell, or sing, or to play, use, operate or permit to be played, used or operated any radio receiving set, musical instrument, phonograph, tape player, television receiving set, loudspeaker, sound amplifier, microphone or other machine or device for the production or reproduction of sound in such a manner as to create a noise disturbance across a residential real property boundary.
- $\frac{4-4-3 \text{ Exceptions}}{4-4-3 \text{ Exceptions}}$. The provisions of this ARTICLE IV shall not apply to the following.
- A. The emission of sound for the purpose of alerting persons to the existence of an emergency, or for the performance of emergency work;

- B. Organized school-related programs, activities or events, or parades or other public programs, activities, or events authorized by the village president and board of trustees or his or their designated representative, including but not limited to the Annual Mt. Auburn Picnic.
- 4-4-4 Violation--Penalty. Any person violating any provision of this ARTICLE IV shall be fined not less than fifty dollars nor more than five hundred dollars for each offense, and a separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues.

Section 2. If any section, clause, provision or portion of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect or otherwise impair any other section, clause, provision or portion of this Ordinance which is not, in or of itself, invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.
